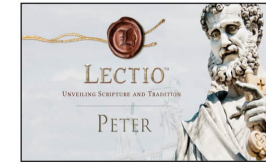

PENITENTIAL RETREAT

Christ's Peace House of Prayer will host a penitential retreat in response to the abuse crisis in the Church the first weekend of Advent, **Friday, November 30 through Sunday, December 2, 2018**. The retreat will begin on Friday evening with check-in at 6:00pm, orientation at 6:30pm, Mass at 7:00pm, outdoor Stations of the Cross and the beginning of perpetual adoration for the weekend. Saturday begins with morning prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours at 8am, Mass at 10am, Angelus at noon, Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3pm, evening prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours at 4pm and night prayer at 9pm. Sunday will begin with morning prayer at 8am and Mass at 10am. The retreat will also feature silence and fasting on bread and water only. **There is no charge for the retreat;** however, we will ask that people help by giving alms. Funds collected will be given to an organization for abuse victims. *People are welcome to spend the night, come for a day or for part of a day.* We want as many people to come as want to help in this time of crisis.
